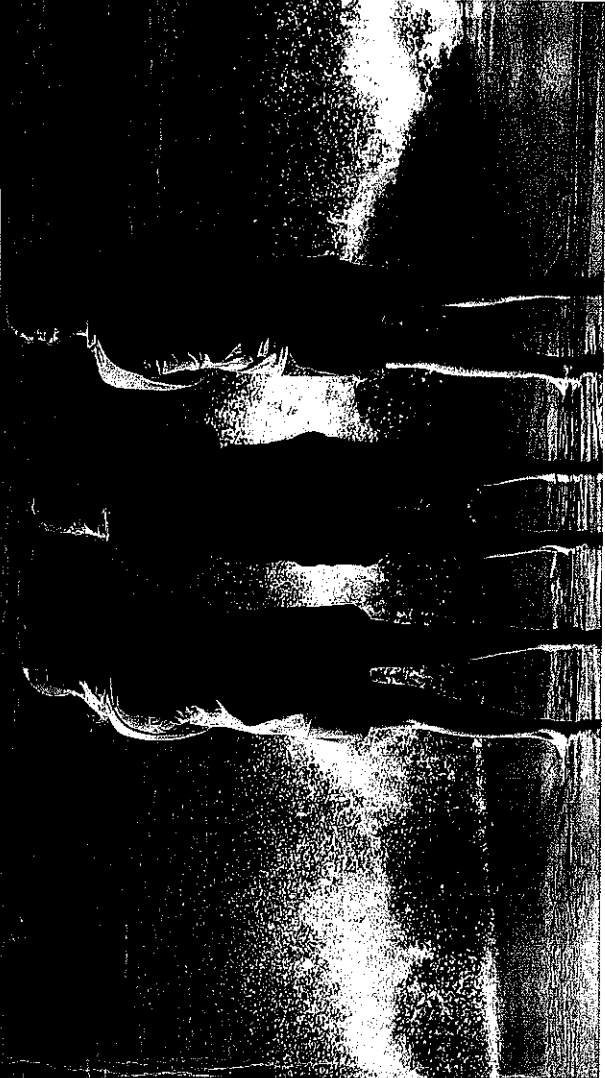

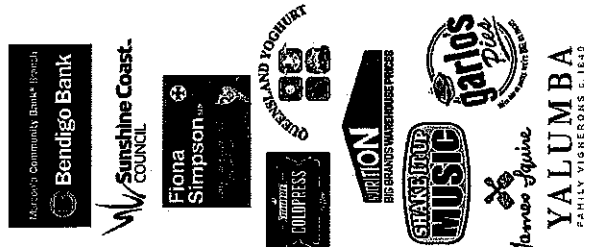

1) Leases

FROM THE PRESIDENT

As I sit here writing my final report as President of the Marcoola Surf Life Saving Club I am overwhelmed by the dedication of our members and their contribution to our community. The hours spent patrolling, training, fundraising, roving, analysing, debating, planning, cleaning, preparing, fixing, watching over and everything else that goes into saving lives on our beaches goes to show what a significant impact we all make here on the beach. All members should be proud of their contribution because I know we are held in high regard by the lifesaving fraternity for our dedication to our core services.

Myself and the committee would like to thank you all for making Marcoola Surf Club what it is. The club would not be what it is without our members. I will not be running again next year as I feel it is time for some new fresh ideas and will be busy assisting with the 50 Year Planning Celebrations next year. May I implore everyone to help out, nominate for a position where you can and above all serve your club to make it great for others to continue the legacy.

This year, again we had no loss of life between our flags. With over 6,000 patrolling hours by our members protecting the community and our beach goers. Patrols this year saved 12 lives, did 1391 preventative actions, treated over 50 first aid and blue bottle cases and around 20,000 people visited our beach, not a bad effort from a club with only 120 Active Lifesavers.

A major change this year was gaining the addition of an experienced Lifesaving Administrator in Olivia Wilson and sadly the retirement of an absolute champion of a lady and Administrator in Lyn Mathison. Olivia has grasped the reins well and will be an asset for the club into the future. She will have very big shoes to fill as Lyn, having been our administrator for 19 years has an absolute wealth of knowledge and experience and has been one of the most dedicated, loyal and hard working staff and club member's I have ever come across. Her diligence, attention to detail and work ethic are a testament to her character and I for one, comprehend how extremely fortunate we were to have her services for such a long time. Lyn, on behalf of all members of the club we thank you for your contribution. It was enormous and has kept our club at the forefront of Lifesaving in QLD and the Sunshine Coast thanks to your efforts.

To our Committees, both Supporters and Surf, the job continues in keeping the place running preparing budgets and getting ready for another year/ season. Thank you all for your dedication and contribution you are truly going above and beyond. We could not survive without your efforts and time given to run our club and organisation.

Membership
It is as pleasing to see us retain a larger percentage of our members than in past years with a retention rate of 75% Vs 65% the previous years. We also increased our overall membership and Junior Membership but dropped back on Active members which we will continue to work on and recruit to cover our beach. The time constraints and burden placed on Volunteers affects how we retain and/ or gain new members and it is great to see the SLSA Board is addressing this issue and has implemented some changes including reducing their policies from 15 to 19 see the excerpt below from their latest newsletter. They are also reducing membership categories from 15 to 5 and introducing a new community member category.

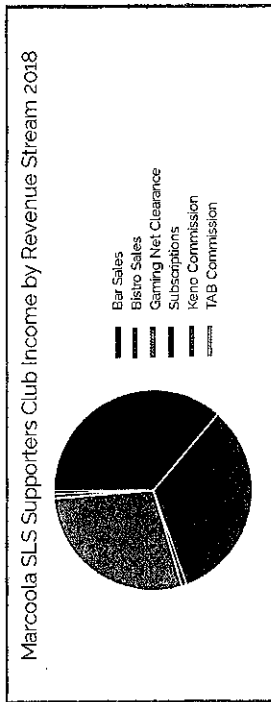

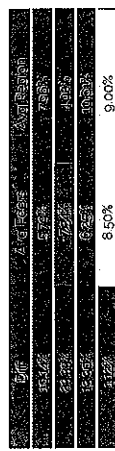

As you will see from the graph below our major income streams are similar in their contribution to our revenue and are closely interlinked and dependant on each other. We have also added a new income stream this year in the TAB Racing terminals and whilst the figures below are not representative of our income potential going forward as we are subsidised for the first 12 months. To keep up with our competitors we need to keep offering our customers alternative sources of entertainment.



A continuing review of our gaming machines to keep them up to date with several game changes and the introduction of new technology and games including the member kiosk and ticket generator has maintained our Gaming Operations at the forefront of our competitors and peers by around 6 to 8%. We will continue to provide upgrades to the gaming area to deliver patron comfort to both gaming and other club visitors. The graph below shows how we have compared against our peers and others within the regional averages for the month of April.



Our function rooms are available for all members to hire out if required and you will be sure to be looked after. The Active Lifesaver Discount and Points reward system and Social member discounts apply and we urge you to take advantage of these initiatives offered by the club to reward those members that provide our vital lifesaving service and our social members.

This year Craig instigated a small get together of Community Leaders "looking in from outside the business" which has sought a range of new ideas and strategies that we can employ to stay at the forefront of hospitality in our area. I'm sure the committee will be looking at adopting some of these in the near future. I would like to express a special thanks to all of our staff who have worked diligently during the year to help us achieve all of these results. To Cameron Meninga, Tannee, Johnno, Leigh, Mait & Brad who have lead our teams we thank you.

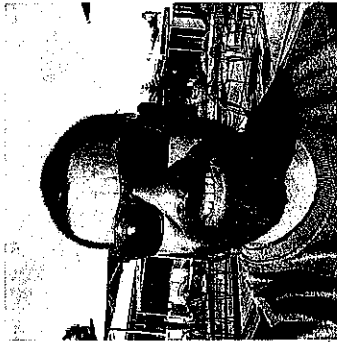

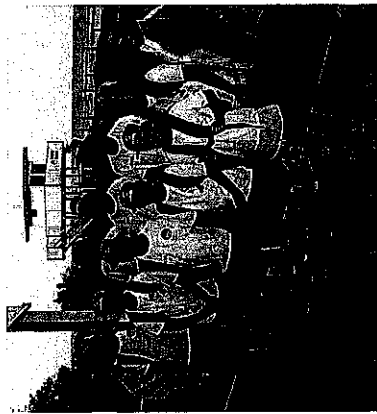
Lynn - thank you for your guidance, patience and friendship this past year. You've got a lot of knowledge in your head and I hope I can do half the job you did!

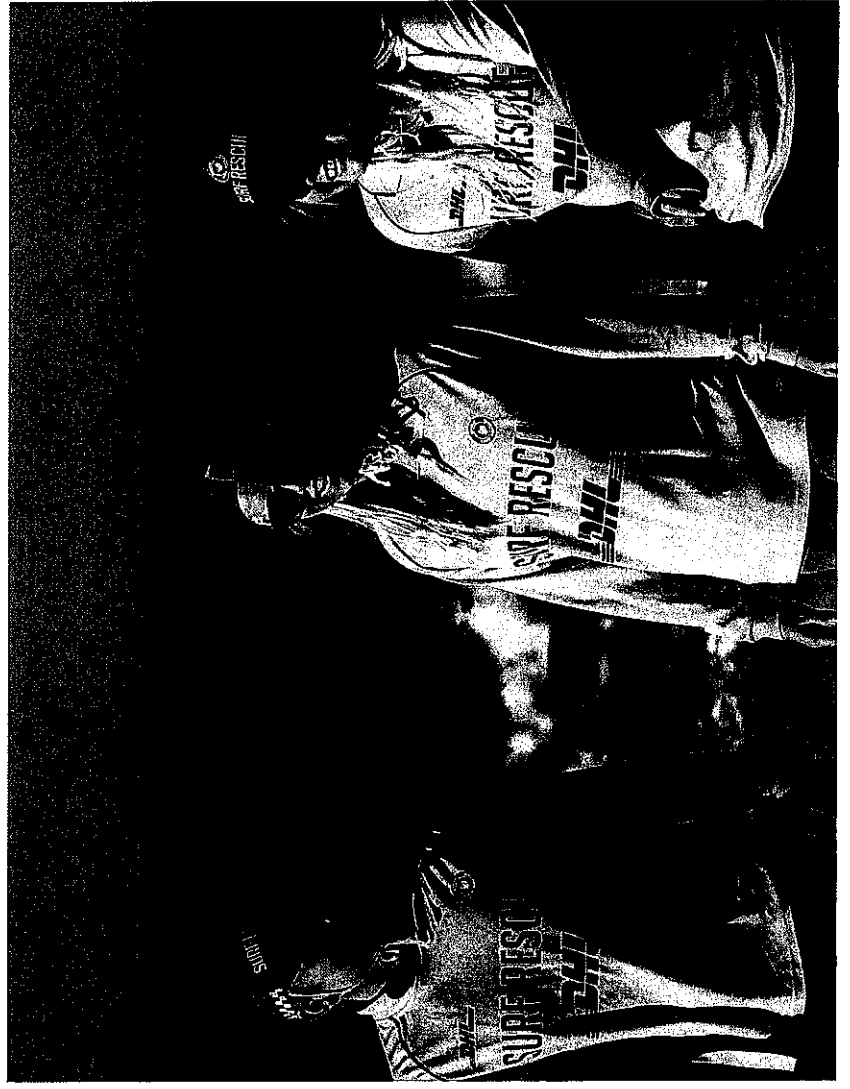

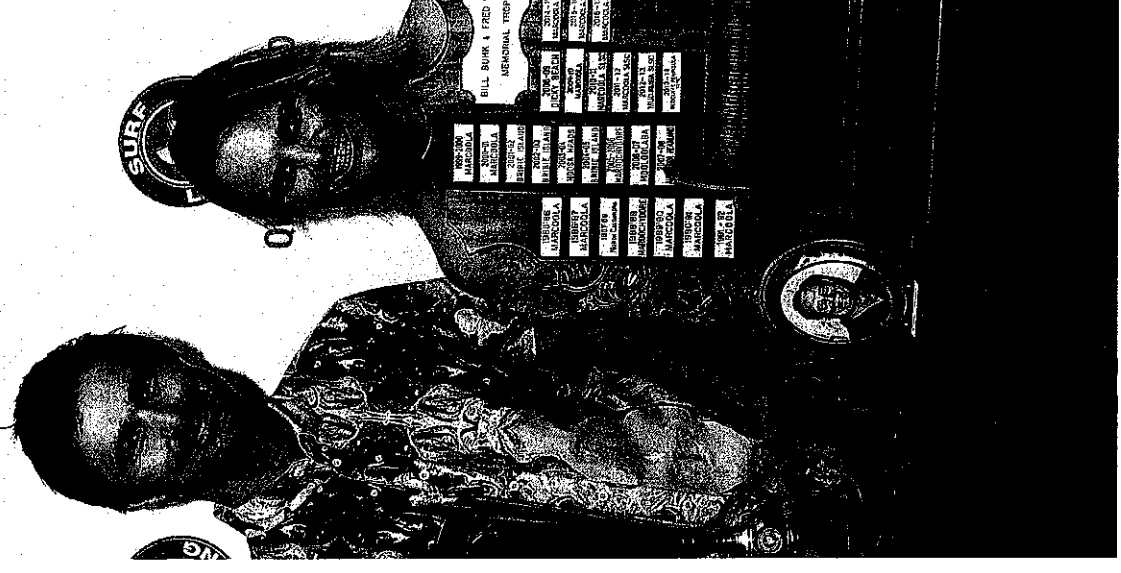

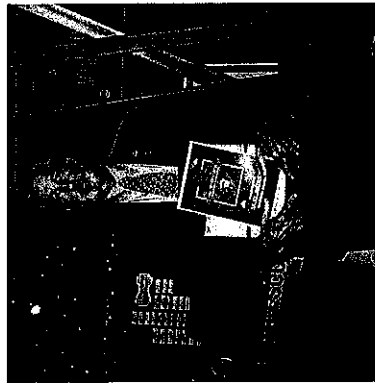
Both Bill Buhk and Fred Wilkes, in whose name the Trophy is dedicated, placed great emphasis on the standard of our grass roots responsibility in all aspects of surf lifesaving, not just for a few months of the season, but for the entire patrolling period. The Trophy is presented annually to the Sunshine Coast Club that meets the criteria and highest standard of proficiency both in the Club house and on the beach that these men greatly respected and firmly upheld during their time of service.

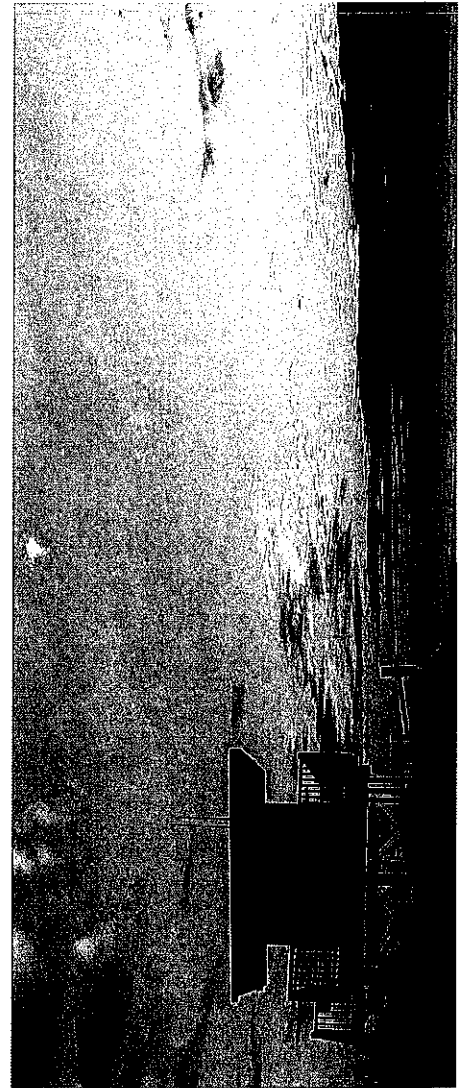
All the Radio Operators have adapted to LIMSOC very well so we will probably see some of the paper duplication of records gradually being withdrawn and become obsolete.
